MOBAK Foundation provides residential and non-residential support to children and youth once they leave a Children's Home in Trinidad and Tobago. Our services strive to provide housing, food, educational support, life skills training, counselling, and a safe and supportive environment for youth to thrive.

Outside of Trinidad and Tobago, MOBAK Foundation extends its services to assist children and youth who face various forms of adversity to overcome them by offering programs that reduce income and food instability through coaching, academic and housing support.

MOBAK House

MOBAK House Chaguanas is a new transitional space that opened in 2022 to provide residential care and support for youth at risk of homelessness. The House offers safety for young people, tutoring, training, food and a supportive environment to thrive. Staff and volunteers mentor the youth and provide opportunities to reduce potential conflict with the law.

- 90% access educational programming
- 100% receive mental health supports
- 54 tutoring sessions held

MOBAK Grants

Grant support academic achievement, boast entrepreneurial opportunities and provide housing support for youth 18 to 29 within the Caribbean and Ghana.

- 20 grants provided to help youth access housing, start a business and complete school

MOBAK Social Enterprise

Mojuisi was launched as a social enterprise to support the operations of MOBAK Foundation.

Addressing Youth Homelessness

Our programming experience has indicated that 92% of youth exit care without the financial means to support themselves and therefore enter into poverty, unstable housing and even homelessness. Over 60% do not have the academic qualifications, employment, culinary and life skills to navigate adulthood. Therefore, to prevent them from falling into the life trap MOBAK transitional program provides housing support, skill development and a sense of belonging for all youth leaving care.

Darren (not real name), an 18-year-old Secondary School student has just been told by his caregiver at his Children's Home that he has 3 weeks to find a new home as he has now aged out of the children's home. Darren has no biological family and has exams in a few months to sit and now is burdened with facing youth homelessness and sudden financial burdens. He was referred to MOBAK Foundation by his caregiver and moved in. Darren received financial support, educational assistance through tutoring programs and life skills support at his new home.

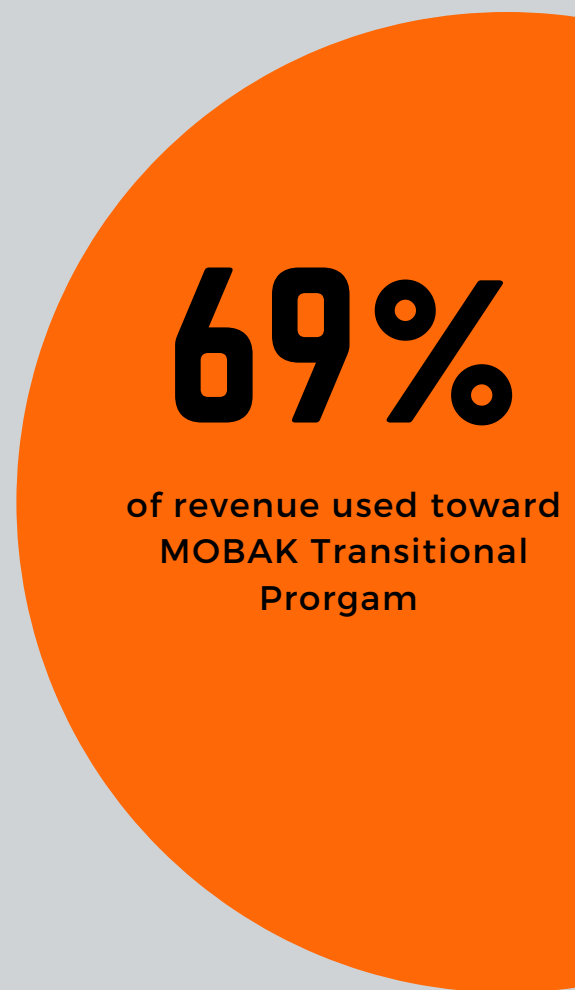
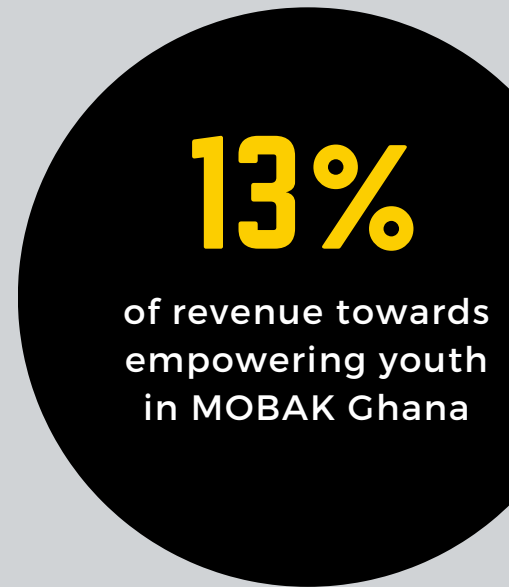
