MOBAK House in Chaguanas provides a lifeline to young men transitioning from the child welfare system. In 2023, this residential program offered:

- Stable housing and a supportive environment.
- Educational and tutoring support to enhance academic potential.
- Counseling and mentorship, fostering personal growth and maturity.
- Life skills training, preparing residents for independent living.



By the Numbers in 2023:

- 120 hours of educational support.
- 4,160 meals provided.
- 1,040 counseling and goal-keeping sessions.

The impact is clear: residents are thriving, demonstrating remarkable behavioral changes and readiness for the future.

Mojuisi Juice Bar, nestled in Port-of-Spain's Breakfast Shed, is more than just a business—it's a mission-driven initiative.

In 2023, Mojuisi provided:

- Employment opportunities to youth overcoming challenges.
- Revenue streams that directly funded housing and food programs.
- A platform for professional and personal growth.

As a beloved fixture in the community, every beverage purchased at Mojuisi supports MOBAK's broader mission. Looking ahead, we plan to expand Mojuisi's reach through new locations and product lines, amplifying its impact on the lives of many.

MOBAK in Ghana

MOBAK Foundation Ghana is a testament to our commitment to global impact. In 2023, we supported 1,120 children and youth across three regions, focusing on education, employment, and food stability.

Key Achievements:

- 1,000 Book Project: Delivered educational supplies to underprivileged schools, including Obom Presby School.
- Vocational Training: Equipped 100 youth with skills in soap-making, creating income opportunities.
- MOBAK Farms: Acquired 10 acres to cultivate crops, addressing food instability and creating jobs.
- Through these initiatives, MOBAK Ghana continues to empower communities, one program at a time.
